Gates and doors giving access to the pool must always be kept securely closed while they are not in use. High penalties apply for non-compliance. It is essential that parents and carers carefully supervise young children around swimming pools at all times. Parents should also consider beginning swimming lessons for their young children from an early age. This pool safety certificate does not certify that a building development approval has been given for the pool or the barriers for the pool. You can contact your local government to ensure this approval is in place.
